We are FOR stable and affordable housing for **every family** in our region so that they can get a foothold in our community, and access the resources they need to thrive..

We are FOR cultural and natural resources that educate and enhance the quality of life for **everyone** in our region.

We are FOR **keeping** the Triangle the Best Place to Live – for **everyone** in the Triangle.

I have a hunch that **you** are all FOR these things too. And that when we break down the noise, and peel back the narrative that has been created for us, we see that it's not about sides. **It's about people**.
